It is important that volunteers know that they are making a difference for the sport organization itself, and for its participants. Showing appreciation for your volunteers will keep them eager to continue their support and to speak positively about your organization to others. In addition, it will build long-lasting relationships and strengthen your organization for years to come.

Develop a Volunteer Recognition Plan

Timing:

When will you recognize your volunteers?



Beginning of season

Host an Orientation Session: provide an introduction to the organization and team, explain volunteers' importance to organization, show appreciation for volunteers' time and commitment

Mid-Season

Volunteer appreciation event

End of Season

Ensure volunteer's experience ends on a positive note

Annually

National Volunteer Week

Activities:

How will you show your appreciation?

- Spotlight your volunteers and recognize the impact they have on your organization through your newsletter and social media.
- Use storytelling to highlight the important role volunteers play in your organization.
- Create a volunteer of the month award.
- Encourage peer recognition- provide a method for volunteer s to recognize their teammates.
- Host an appreciation event.
- Say thank you often.

Check in with regularly with your volunteers learn more about their experience:

Be open to feedback and questions

Create the opportunity for volunteers to share their experiences, provide feedback and get their questions answered

Develop an exit survey for volunteers
